# Emery County Library System 2022 - 2025 Strategic Plan

## **Mission Statement**

The mission of the Emery County Libraries is to provide people of all ages and backgrounds free and open access to a broad range of resources and services for lifelong learning, spaces and opportunities to gather and connect, and to foster a love of reading.

## **Vision Statement**

We strive to enrich the communities of Emery County by empowering all residents with impartial and inclusive access to a wide range of resources, services, and programs to support lifelong learning. We are the welcoming heart of each of the communities in Emery County where anyone may come to think, learn, discover, create, share, and connect. We bring people together to find, share, and create information and knowledge and connect with others in a safe space.

1. Service - Emery County Libraries are community hubs that are an essential part of each community.

Goal 1.1: Increase accessibility of services at Emery County Libraries

#### **Projects:**

- 1. Return to extended hours (including 11 evening/weekend hours)
- 2. Operate iHubs with 24 hours per day access
- 3. Create new website that is easy for the public to navigate and use
- 4. Catalog cleaning project to populate ghost records, remove duplicate records, associate images with all records, and overall improve the quality of the library catalog
- 5. Clean the card catalog (including filling out ghost records, removing duplicates, tying records to images, etc.)
- 6. Green River Library (including DMV) open 5 days per week
- Goal 1.2: Increase public awareness of all services at Emery County Libraries

- 1. Promote programming through publicizing newsletters on public bulletin boards and utilizing multiple social media platforms
- 2. Increase volunteer opportunities in libraries
- 3. Expand website to highlight new programs, services, and resources
- 4. Participate in Emery County Fair to highlight resources, services, and programs at the libraries
- 5. Participate in community celebrations as community libraries



#### 2. Connection - Emery County Libraries are partners in community enrichment.

**Goal 2.1:** Create ongoing partnerships between Emery County Libraries and government, local organizations, and community partners

#### **Projects:**

- 1. Partnerships with Emery County Departments (i.e., Aquatic Center, Archives, Courts, DMV, EMS, San Rafael Health and Rehabilitation, Senior Centers, Sheriff's Office, Travel Department, etc.)
- 2. Partnerships with local organizations (i.e., 4H, Family History Center, Emery County Business Chamber, etc.)
- 3. Partnerships with community partners (i.e., Emery County School District, Rural Utah Child Development, Early Intervention, etc.)
- 4. Partnerships with State organizations (i.e., Utah State Library Division (USL), Utah State University (USU), Utah Education and Telehealth Network (UETN), etc.)

**Goal 2.2:** Create opportunities in arts, culture, education, and connection for the enhancement and well-being of the community at Emery County Libraries

- 1. Develop experiential learning opportunities through active and passive programming that facilitates enrichment of the community
- 2. Create system-wide initiatives to connect communities in Emery County through the libraries



3. Inclusion - Emery County Libraries are safe spaces where differences are celebrated and supported.

Goal 3.1: Continue making Emery County Libraries safe spaces for everyone

#### Projects:

- 1. Install cameras on the exterior of libraries where ballot boxes are located and interior of libraries to assist library staff in monitoring the libraries
- 2. Include safety topics in staff development including monthly safety minutes to increase awareness of safety sensitive issues and facilitating an annual conversation with Emery County Sheriff's Office regarding safety issues
- 3. Install AED machines in libraries and continually train staff on use and additional life saving techniques

Goal 3.2: Adapt Emery County Library facilities to make them accessible to all

#### **Projects:**

- 1. Removed uneven concrete at Huntington Branch Library and create an entrance to the library that is compliant with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards
- 2. Update signage outside and within the libraries to comply with ADA standards
- 3. Evaluate floor plans, furniture, equipment, and fixtures within libraries to maximize accessibility for all people, and create plans for reorganization

**Goal 3.3:** Create safe digital spaces within Emery County Libraries as well beyond the libraries' walls

#### **Projects:**

1. Maintain dynamic filtering within the libraries with an option to disable the filter when requested by adults, and install filtering software on all circulating laptops and iPads

Goal 3.4: Create programming that celebrates and supports differences

- 1. Include depictions of varied people, cultures, experiences, etc. in story times and programming to include as many as possible
- 2. Develop active and passive programming that celebrates differences



4. Lifelong Learning - Emery County Libraries encourage and promote personal growth at all ages.

**Goal 4.1:** Provide access to varied resources promoting equity, diversity, and inclusion at and through Emery County Libraries

#### **Projects:**

- 1. Incorporate resources into each libraries' collections for people and groups not previously included in the collections
- 2. Encourage use of interlibrary loan services to facilitate access to a larger pool of resources

**Goal 4.2:** Create opportunities for people to think, learn, discover, create, share, and connect freely at Emery County Libraries

#### **Projects:**

- 1. Increase active programming for all ages at all locations by setting minimum active programming requirements based on intended audiences
- 2. Increase passive programming for all ages at all locations by setting minimum passive programming requirements based on intended audiences
- 3. Develop and maintain maker carts/spaces at libraries
- 4. Create and maintain a Library of Things collection (including varied mobile devices)

**Goal 4.3:** Encourage Emery County Libraries staff to develop professional networks and actively engage in continued education on an ongoing basis

- 1. Provide staff opportunities to meet, share knowledge, and collaborate in-person and in digital spaces
- 2. Create mentorship opportunities for new staff to learn from experienced staff
- 3. Provide staff opportunities to attend professional conferences and workshops
- 4. Encourage staff to participate in online training opportunities



5. Sustainability - Emery County Libraries are committed to maintaining our eight branch libraries and preparing our facilities for the future.

**Goal 5.1:** Maintain Emery County Libraries facilities through scheduled maintenance and schedule replacement of fixtures, equipment, furniture, and grounds

#### **Projects:**

- 1. Annually inspect all facilities and evaluate the status of all equipment, furniture, fixtures, etc. for upcoming year
- 2. Create and implement fixture and equipment replacement schedule
- 3. Evaluate all library grounds (including landscaping and sprinkler systems) and develop a plan for sustainability
- 4. Identify and resolve issues regarding property boundaries

**Goal 5.2:** Implement long-term cost saving strategies to increase long term viability of Emery County Libraries

#### **Projects:**

- Explore opportunities to reduce recurring monthly costs such as Voice Over Internet Protocol (VoIP) for phone service, UETN circuits for internet services, replacing propane with natural gas, solar panels, etc. and implement strategies
- 2. Explore opportunities for cost-saving measures such as programmable thermostats, replacing windows, adding insulation to buildings, removing fixtures no longer in use, etc. and implement measures

**Goal 5.3:** Maintain up-to-date technology and online resources for Emery County Libraries' patrons and staff

- 1. Replace staff computers with laptops with docking stations and monitors
- 2. Create and implement replacement schedules for patron desktop computers, mobile devices, and staff computers
- 3. Evaluate library management system and explore options for better usability for patrons and staff
- 4. Test website links monthly and fix issues with website as they are identified
